## **SHOW AWARDS**

Listed on the back page are the winners of cups at the 2016 show. An exhibitor with the highest total points within the award category wins the cup. Exhibitors need to enter a number of classes within an award category, and their entries must be judged first second or third to score points.

A first prize receives 3 points, a second prize receives 2 points and a third 1 point. In the event of a tie on points the quality of points awarded shall determine the cup winner e.g. the number of first prizes, seconds, etc. The Collection of Vegetables winner (Item 1) is calculated using the total RHS points gained.

Many who win individual class awards are not mentioned, because their entries did not score enough points to win a cup. Thank you for entering if you were one such exhibitor, and well done. Perhaps this year you will enter more exhibits and will win a cup?

Along with this schedule a separate 'Hints to Exhibitors' sheet has been produced and is available from the Show Secretary.

And don't forget that the Gardening Club meets on the first Wednesday of each month with a guest speaker, along with two garden outings a year. Non-members are always welcome. Here you will be able to meet likeminded gardening enthusiasts and pick up tips and hints for successful growing.

## **RULES FOR EXHIBITORS**

1. All exhibits to be staged on the morning of the show between 9am and 10.30am.
2. The Committee reserve the right to inspect any exhibitor's garden.
3. The Committee will not be responsible for any loss or damage to exhibits or exhibitor's property.
4. All exhibits must be the property of the exhibitor. Classes 1 – 60 must have been grown by the exhibitor in their own garden or allotment. Pot plants, classes 53 – 55 must have been in the exhibitor's possession for at least 6 weeks prior to the show.
5. No exhibits or prize cards are to be removed before 4pm.
6. All vegetables are to be washed and trimmed unless otherwise stated.
7. No entry in the craft section is to have been previously entered in a Morchard Bishop show.
8. Only one entry per class per person. All entries are to have been made or produced by the exhibitor.
9. Exhibitors should bring their own vases, trays or dishes for staging exhibits, except where stated.
10. Prize money is to be collected between 4pm and 5pm. Monies not collected by 5pm will be deemed to be donated to prize funds.
11. The committee reserves the right to refuse any entry and shall not be required to give any reason for such refusal.
12. Any protest must be lodged in writing with the Secretary or other committee member together with a deposit of 50p before 4pm. The deposit will be returned if the protest is upheld.
13. All entries will be auctioned unless marked with RED STICKERS obtained from the Stewards.
14. Cards corresponding to the entries will be on the exhibit tables on the morning of the show and must be placed name down, with the exhibits.
15. In case of dispute, the Committee's decision is final.

### Recipe

250mls sunflower oil, 4 large eggs, 225g light muscovado sugar, 200g grated carrot, 300g self-raising flour, 2tsp baking powder, 1tsp mixed spice, 1tsp ground ginger, 75g chopped walnuts plus 8 halves to decorate.

Icing: 50g butter at room temperature, 25g icing sugar, 250g full-fat cream cheese, a few drops of vanilla extract.

### Method

1. Pre heat oven, 180c/fan 160c/gas 4. Grease 2 deep 8 inch sandwich tins and line bottom.
2. Put oil, eggs and sugar into a large mixing bowl and whisk until lighter in colour and slightly thickened. Fold in carrot, flour baking powder, ginger, mixed spice and walnuts carefully.
3. Divide mixture evenly between the two tins and bake for 35mins. Turn out and leave to cool on wire rack.
4. Mix all icing ingredients together, then sandwich cakes together with half of the icing and use the rest to decorate the top, and finish with halved walnuts.
